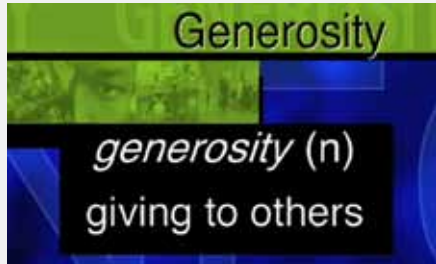


Character and Life Skills: **Generosity**

Pre-Viewing and Discussion Questions

Grade Level: **3-5**



Before watching...

Pre-viewing activities or discussions help focus attention when watching a video and build critical thinking skills. Consider asking students to interview each other about the term.

After Watching...

Discussion Questions

1. The kids say generosity is “not exactly giving to other people, it’s helping, giving part of your life and spirit to others” and “when somebody goes out of their way not necessarily in their benefit to help you.” How do you define generosity?
2. What are some examples of times that you have been generous? What did you do? How did that make others feel?
3. One boy says he can be generous, but it “depends on what kind of mood I’m in.” How do you relate to this? Do you have to be in a certain mood to be generous? Explain.
4. The kids mention how their parents, their siblings, and other people are generous. What examples of generosity by other have you witnessed or experienced?
5. The last speaker says, “If everyone was generous in the world, there would be no more war.” Do you agree or disagree? Why? What are some other problems generosity might solve?
