Character and Life Skills: Patience Pre-Viewing and Discussion Questions Grade Level: 3-5



Before watching...

Pre-viewing activities or discussions help focus attention when watching a video and build critical thinking skills. Consider pointing out the difference between the homonyms "patience" and "patients."

After Watching...

Discussion Questions

- **1.** The kids say patience is "waiting for something you want" and "waiting for your turn or for somebody else." How do you define patience?
- 2. The kids give examples of time you need patience. What are their examples? What are some examples of times you needed patience in your own life?
- **3.** If 1 stands for "no patience at all" and 5 stands for "I can be patient all day," how would you rate your own personal patience? Explain your answer.
- **4.** Create scenarios where you would need patience and ask the class to use the scale to rate their patience in each situation (e.g., waiting in a long line for a ride at an amusement park, waiting your turn at bat in a baseball game, waiting for your cousins to arrive, etc.). Discuss the student responses. Consider graphing the responses and analyzing the data with the group.
